smaller groups for discussions about the Bible lesson in the morning, and in the afternoons we met with the older students again for classes in English, sports, and music. After that, we usually went to the Tony Wolfe soccer park. The guys would play soccer with the Haitians and the ladies would play with the children and initiate conversations on the sidelines. After one such day, one of our college men shared his testimony with all the young men gathered there. Only eternity will tell the results of that time together! Then in the evening we had our team meetings, worshipped and planned for the next day. All in all, a very full day!

At night during our team meetings Dan would ask the question, "Where did you see God

today?" Come back with us and "hear" some of their God-sightings:

- In the older boy's club, they divided into small groups where some of the boys opened up and asked bold and honest questions. "Some shared how difficult it is for a Haitian male to forgive; that to forgive someone is to "lose respect".

- They saw God in "the guy at the soccer field who refused to be distracted by his friends while David was sharing his testimony."

- They saw God in the "new relationships that were formed between our team and the children we spent time with. THEY showed us Jesus as much and probably more than we showed them."

- A few of the older girls who had exhibited a negative attitude in the beginning, "shared the song "Ancient Words" in the music class in preparation for the parents program when we couldn't decide what to sing. It ended up being a gift from God as they stepped up and became leaders and taught the rest of the group." God was working in their lives.

Reflections from Belle Sartin

As a student going on my first international missions trip, I had no expectations since I had no idea what to expect! Needless to say, a lot of what I saw in Haiti was shocking to me. I had never before seen a third-world country face to face like that, seeing it, hearing it, smelling it, putting names and faces with such poverty. But God showed me that He walks the streets of Anse-a-Galets, holding the hands of the children that I got to spend a few short days with, loving them and knowing them deeply when I could only scratch the surface.

Part of me had thought that I was going to bring Christ to a place He had never been before; I was going to bring the Light to a very dark place. And while I was a light, *The Light* had never left LaGonave. The Lord knows Haiti and loves her people. He has never abandoned them and never will because that is not who He is. I hope that I get to go back to Haiti very soon. The Lord is clearly present and is doing miraculous things, big and small, that will make their mark on eternity.
